Texas Lutheran University

Texas Lutheran University (TLU) is a private, residential university affiliated with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America offering Bachelor and selected Masters Degrees. Founded in 1891 in Brenham, Texas, TLU moved to Seguin in 1912. We are located approximately 30 miles east of San Antonio, 40 miles south of Austin, and 130 miles west of Houston. Outdoor recreation opportunities on the Guadalupe River, Lake McQueeney and many other water ways and parks are within easy driving distance. San Antonio and Austin provide many venues for entertainment, shopping, and cultural events.

Our most recent basic Carnegie classification is Baccalaureate Diverse Fields. Business Administration and Accounting, Kinesiology, Education, Biology, and Psychology are the top five majors and degrees awarded.

TLU has one of the most diverse student body populations in the nation, according to *US News and World Report's* annual college and university rankings. With the fall of 2010 enrollment, TLU became eligible for Hispanic Serving Institution status. In the fall 2020 term, TLU has maintained eligibility as a Hispanic Serving Institution with a 41% Hispanic population. Total fall 2021 student head count was 1,441 with an entering freshmen class of 312. The total student head count also included our newest program students, the Alternative Bachelor of Science in Nursing (ABSN).

We participate in NCAA division III athletics in the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) in all sports except football which is in the American Southwest Conference. Many of our athletes are chosen for Academic All Conference teams. Only athletes with a minimum 3.0 grade point average are chosen for this honor. Approximately 30% of our students participate in athletics.

At TLU, students participate in Theater, Visual Media, and the School of Music where they acquire professional level knowledge and skills in both the academic discipline and the performance of the art. For instance, in the School of Music, a student may major in music or music education or participate in jazz band, string ensemble, woodwind ensemble, other bands and various choir groups while pursuing a career in another discipline. The opportunity to pursue an avocation as well as a career is available to all students and is a cornerstone of a well-rounded liberal arts education.

The quality of our faculty members and their dedication to teaching are among TLU's many strengths. Our students participate in faculty-led student research, internships, conference presentations, and other high impact educational and co-curricular activities.

TLU, a community of faith and learning, offers a wide range of academic programs and prepares students to lead lives of purpose. Our students learn boldly and live to inspire.







Mean SAT Scores with Standard Deviation




Cohort Retention Rates to Term 2 and Term 3




Fall 1 to Fall 2 Freshmen Retention in Ethnic Group


Fall 1 to Fall 2 Freshmen Retention by Known First Generation Status

Comparison of 4-Year Graduation Rates to National Group








Comparison of 6-Year Graduation Rates To National Group By Ethnicity




Comparison of 6-Year Black or African American Graduation Rates








of Students that filed FAFSA


